My, how so many things in our lives can change on a dime – so many of which we tend to take for granted. It's hard to believe that only a couple of weeks ago we were moving along with our "normal" daily lives and church lives. MOST of that has changed dramatically in our daily routine, in our work lives and in the way we gather to worship each week. More specifically, the changes mean that our Adult Choir can't safely meet and rehearse each week, as much as they would LOVE to. It was my decision to be extra cautious to suspend rehearsals for the next few weeks, though the majority of choir members were hoping to continue. The group size is too large for safe social distancing. It also means that we are increasingly using the Adult Praise Team to lead in worship as they are available. They've done such a wonderful job of doing that for the last three Sundays. I'm so proud of their dedication. And it means that we will use other small groups or soloists for special music on Sunday morning during this crisis – as they are available and willing.

What about the Easter cantata? When we had to suspend rehearsals, we had worked on all songs but one. If everything returns to normal in the next couple of weeks, it's possible to still present the cantata on Easter morning. However as the virus evolves, I frankly see that as being a long shot. We will play it by ear.

So, while there's some scaling back on the numbers of people involved to foster social distancing as best we can, we are thankful that the music ministry continues right along. God will bless our efforts to do the best we can, and we continue to thank Him for this opportunity and blessing!

Stay positive, safe and well. God is not surprised by any of this. Trust Him and find a way to worship each day through music, however and whenever you access it.
