Women on Mission is a division of the Women's Missionary Union. The organization offers many opportunities for expanding knowledge and understanding. Here are some WOM recent activities. On three Tuesdays in May, ladies participated in a virtual tour of Denver that featured twelve church planners who described their strategies and visions. Seven families from Texas moved to Colorado with one planner to start a church. Secondly, the devotionals in the Mission Mosaic magazine feature scripture, insightful and inspiring accounts, and a prayer focus for the day. These daily sessions produce personal strength and spiritual growth. Additionally, a recent study of the book of Zechariah, guided by a Mission Mosaic article, revealed the prophet urging the Jews of Jerusalem to repent and to rebuild the temple. A goal of studying Zechariah was to distinguish the attributes of God and the activities of God. Next, through WOM, a daily prayer guide, "21 Days of Prayer for the Coronavirus," featured 21 categories of people affected by the virus. 
