Taken from C.H. Spurgeon Morning & Evening

"I sleep, but my heart waketh" Song of Solomon 5:2

Paradoxes abound in Christian experience. In our text this evening, the spouse was asleep, and yet she was awake. Only those who have experienced Christianity can understand the paradox of a believer's life. The two points this evening are a mournful sleepiness and a hopeful wakefulness. I sleep. Through sin that dwells in us, we may become lax in spending time with God, slothful in prayer, dull in spiritual joy, and altogether lazy and careless. This is a shameful state for one in whom the Holy Spirit dwells. It is also extremely dangerous. It is time for all to shake off the bands of sloth. Many believers lose their strength, as Samson lost his locks of hair, while sleeping on the lap of carnal security. With a perishing world around us, it is cruel to sleep. Since eternity is so near at hand, it is madness. Yet, none of us are as awake as we should be. A few thunderclaps would do us all good. Unless we soon rouse ourselves, we may have them in the form of war, pestilence, or personal losses. May we leave the couch of fleshly ease forever and go forth with flaming torches to meet the coming Bridegroom! *My heart waketh*. This is a happy sign. Life is not extinct, though sadly smothered. When our renewed heart struggles against our natural heaviness, we should be grateful to sovereign grace for keeping vitality within the body of this death. Jesus will hear, help, and visit our hearts. The voice of the vigilant heart is the voice of our Beloved, saying, "Open to me." Holy zeal will surely unbar the door.
